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YOUTH MORNING SESSIONS

Our morning youth sessions fulfill Quality Assurance requirements for Ohio 4-H and for many Ohio counties. These morning sessions are hands-on and educational, using the three Ohio 4-H Good Production Practices to teach youth the importance of caring for their project animals in ways that incorporate these GPPs.

Participants will be split into groups and will rotate through four morning sessions, and **MUST have their card stamped at the completion of each session.** Participants must have **all four squares on their card stamped**, proving their attendance, in order to receive their completion certificate for Quality Assurance.

DairyPalooza will compile lists of all participants by county and forward them to each county extension office within a week of our program completion. Retain your certificate in case your county requires additional proof of attendance.

Note: Youth under age 11 are required to have a parent, guardian or advisor with them during morning sessions.
